DANIEL LOWERY WINS TUNICA NLHE MULTI-FLIGHT

"Duma" moves into eight-place tie on Circuit wins list with Event #2 title

Daniel Lowery, who plays as much tournament poker as he can while also owning and operating a sawmill near Fort Smith, Arkansas, arrived at Circuit Horseshoe Tunica looking for a top-three finish in one of three events at Tunica he planned to play, in hopes of earning a top-50 invite into the 2018-19 season-ending Casino Championship.

Mission accomplished. "Duma", as he's known, routed the field on a lightning-paced Day 2 in Event #2, \$400 No-Limit Hold'em Multi-Flight Re-Entry. Lowery's eighth career Circuit win also earned him a \$52,378 winner's payday.

Lowery's second Circuit win this season (the first came in Tulsa five weeks earlier) likely locks up that Casino Championship seat, and it also gives Lowery's bankroll a boost. He'll be making his first WSOP visit in five years this June, and it also gives him some more money to invest in his sawmill. "I'm always buying equipment. I've seen a couple of things right around \$30K that I wanted. I'll be getting one or the other of them," he noted.
