

# 2011 World Series of Poker Main Event Final Table Fact Sheet

## WHO:

**WHAT:** The conclusion of poker's richest and most prestigious poker tournament, the 42<sup>nd</sup> annual *World Series of Poker Presented by Jack Link's Beef Jerky*. Featuring the November Nine – the final nine players of 6,865 participants in the \$10,000 No-Limit Texas Hold'em World Championship. These nine players are vying for the most coveted prize in poker – the WSOP Championship Bracelet and the winner's prize of \$8,711,956.

**WHERE:** The Penn & Teller Theater at the Rio® All-Suite Hotel and Casino.

**WHEN:** Sunday, November 6<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday, November 8<sup>th</sup>  
*Play on the 6<sup>th</sup> will begin with all nine participants, with cards in the air at 11:30 am PT and play down to three players. On November 8, the final three players face off at 5:30 PM PT and play until we have a winner.*

ESPN will carry every single hand of the final table on both days. Sunday on ESPN2, Tuesday on ESPN. Hole cards will be shown at the completion of a hand, on 15-minute delay, per approved regulations.

**PRIZE** The final nine will play for a total of \$28,269,365 (43.8% of prize pool), plus interest added and accrued from July 20 until the time they return in November. The payout schedule is as follows:

The Main Event total prize pool in 2011 is \$64,531,000. A total of 693 players cashed in the event; payout for 693<sup>rd</sup> place was \$19,359.

**UPON RETURN:** The event resumes with 34 minutes, 57 seconds left in Level 36, with antes 50,000 and blinds at 250,000 and 500,000. Staszko has the button. The small blind will be in Seat 1 with Giannetti and Bounahra will be the big blind.

**2011 WSOP:** The 2011 World Series of Poker attracted a record 75,672 entrants from 105 different nations competing for \$191,999,010 million prize pool over the 58-event, 50-day extravaganza.
