

2010-11 WSOP CIRCUIT CUMULATIVE PLAYER POINT SYSTEM

WSOP PLAYER OF THE YEAR FORMAT TO BE THE BASIS FOR A NATIONAL PLAYER POINT SYSTEM

4 WAYS TO QUALIFY; POINTS VARY BY BUY-IN LEVEL

OVERVIEW

- The 2010-11 WSOP Circuit Event tour will use a *Cumulative Player Point System* to track player success in all official WSOP Circuit open gold ring events.
- The point system is modeled after the WSOP Las Vegas Player of the Year format.
- Players earn points at each WSOP Circuit stop in the United States.
- You must cash in an event to earn points.
- All buy-ins for official preliminary ring events (from \$300-\$1,000 buy-in) will awards points on a 0.5 times basis. (100 points x 0.5 = 50 points).
- All buy-ins for official Main Event (\$1,500 buy-in level) will award points on a 1.0 basis. (100 x 1.0 = 100 points).
- All buy-ins for official Regional Championships (\$10,000 buy-in level) will award points on a 5.0 basis. (100 x 5.0 = 500 points).

QUALIFICATION DETAILS

There are 4 different ways to qualify for the **WSOP Circuit National Championship**. They are:

- 1. Win the \$1,500 Main Event at any WSOP Circuit event. (1 per stop; 15 players total)
- 2. Be the "Casino Champion" accumulating the most points at any of the individual WSOP Circuit stops' 10 official "ring" events. (1 per stop; 15 players total)
- 3. Make the final table (9 players) at any of the four \$10K buy-in "Regional Championships" [Horseshoe Hammond; Harrah's Atlantic City; Harrah's Rincon; Harrah's New Orleans] (36 players total)
- **4.** Accumulate enough points between all the WSOP Circuit stops to be positioned in the Top 34 cumulative point standings at the end of the 2010-11 WSOP Circuit tour.*

^{*}Note: There will likely be several duplicate names who automatically qualified. Each player can only qualify once, therefore the duplicate names will be scrubbed and the next highest-point getters in the cumulative point rankings will qualify.

Notes:

- Standard ring event is any officially-designated WSOP Circuit Event in the U.S. with a \$300-1,000 buy-in that offers a gold ring to the winner.
- \$1500 Main Event is the championship event at each property that awards a ring to the winner.
- \$10,000 Regional event is the nationally-televised event at Horseshoe Hammond; Harrah's Atlantic City, Harrah's Rincon and Harrah's New Orleans that awards the final 9 players in each event an automatic seat in the national championship.
- Points model based on standard nine, eight or six-handed events. Shootouts and heads up tournaments score differently. Please see WSOP.com for details.
