## **Top Four Finishers Reach Agreement in Latest WSOP Circuit Event**

Hammond, IN — Deals are a part of tournament poker. They will be so long as it's players who post the funds which make up the prize pool. It is, after all, the players' money.

The latest World Series of Poker Circuit tournament -- which took place at the Horseshoe Casino in Hammond, near Chicago – included a financial settlement by the final four players.

While the precise terms of the deal were not disclosed, it was agreed that Jeremy Schwartz would sign for first place. He "officially" collected \$42,758 in prize money. He was also credited with the tournament victory and received the Gold Ring, the coveted prize for winning a WSOP Circuit event.

The \$560 buy-in No-Limit Hold'em tournament was played over two consecutive days over a busy weekend at the Horseshoe. The final table was reached after about five hours of play on Day Two. Later, once the fifth-place finisher was eliminated, talk of a deal began and the tournament ended once an agreement was reached.

The tournament attracted a good-sized field of 405 players. The event was played at the same time as the \$1,500 buy-in Main Event Championship. No doubt, many of the players who entered this tournament, had entered the championship, but had busted out.

Those who were fortunate to finish in the top ten spots were as follows:

- **10**<sup>th</sup> **Place** The first player to exit from the last table was Mark Crowley. He is a 46-year-old office manager from New Lenox, IL.
- **9**<sup>th</sup> **Place** Kevin Smith, a self-employed part-time poker player from Osage Beach, MO was the ninth-place finisher.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Place Blake Erickson, a consultant from Carol Stream, IL ended up in eighth place.
- 7<sup>th</sup> Place Angela Valencia, a sales coach from Barrington, IL ended up as the seventh-place finisher.
- 6<sup>th</sup> Place Peter Chen, a 28-year-old systems administrator from Barrington, IL finished in sixth place.
- **5**<sup>th</sup> **Place** Ian Wiley, a 25-year-old professional poker player from Las Vegas, NV was the fourth-place finisher.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Place Mike Deis, a 22-year-old graduate of Michigan State University, ended up in third place.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Place Connor Fulkerson, a chemical engineer from Houston, TX took third place.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place Jon Kidd, a trucking manager from South Beloit, IL was the runner up.
- 1<sup>st</sup> Place Jeremy Schwartz is a 29-year-old investment researcher from Philadelphia, PA. This was the third year Schwartz has played on the WSOP Circuit. This was his first victory.

This is the ninth of 11 Gold Ring events taking place this year at the Horsehose Casino. It marks the third year the Horseshoe has hosted a WSOP Circuit stop. All tournament events take place inside the special events arena called "The Venue." The Horseshoe is conveniently located just a short distance from the Illinois-Indiana border, and is about 20 minutes away from Downtown Chicago.
