## Save the Best for Last: Trevor Deeter Wins the \$365 No-Limit

28-year old Philadelphia native wins his first Circuit Ring.

**Elizabeth, IN (October 8, 2012)** — In an event that could have easily got lost in the shuffle with Day 2 of the Main Event in full swing, the \$365 No-Limit Hold 'em Event 12 did just the opposite. The focus of attention in all of the poker room was the final table and for more than one reason.

A total of 102 entered the event that was originally scheduled for two days. However, when we reach the final table, players decided to play out the event in one day.

As soon as play began, it was clear that this was not going to be any normal final table. First, Kurt Jewell came in as the chip leader. Jewell currently holds four WSOP Circuit Rings, just one short of tying him for the all-time record with Mark "Pegasus" Smith and Kyle Cartwright.

Additionally, Jewell's good friend, Aaron Massey, was also at the final table with a big stack. Just two days prior, Massey won the \$365 No-Limit Hold 'em Turbo event for his first Ring. With 50 points for that victory, Massey was poised to make a run at the Horseshoe Southern Indiana Casino Champion points leader, Scott Carroll. Massey would only need an 7<sup>th</sup> place finish or better to take the lead with only one day left in the Main Event.

Trevor Deeter was at his 6<sup>th</sup> career Circuit final table after just narrowly missing two final tables this series with 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> place finishes.

The final table played at a blistering pace until only three remained; Jewell, Massey and Deeter. Deeter started three-handed play as the short stack but quickly doubled through both Massey and Jewell to take the chip lead. From that point, he would not relinquish it.

Massey would end up third, adding 30 points to Casino Championship points and putting him firmly in first place.

As for Jewell, the four-time Ring winner will have to wait to tie the record of most career Ciruit Ring.

Today was Deeter's day. If there was ever a victory that was hard-earned, it was this one. The Horseshoe Southern Indiana Circuit event may be close to a conclusion, but it clearly saved it's best for last.

## **Notes On The Event**

- Kurt Jewell has now made nine WSOP Circuit final tables and has won four of those.
- The entire tournament took less than 15 hours to complete.

Aaron Massey takes the lead in the Casino Champion points race with 80 points. Only John Taitt and National Championship at-large points leader Jonathan Taylor have a chance to catch him tomorrow during the final day of the Main Event.

The player who accumulates the most overall points in Horseshoe Southern Indiana's twelve combined gold ring tournaments will earn the title "Casino Champion" and receive automatic entry into the \$1 Million 2012-13 WSOP Circuit National Championship, as will the winner of the Horseshoe Southern Indiana Main Event. All players who cash in ring events will receive points that apply to both the Casino Championship race and the season-long race to claim one of the 60 at-large National Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season.
