Bryan Dillon Takes the First Ring at Horseshoe Southern Indiana Kentucky attorney wins his second Circuit ring.

**Elizabeth, IN (October 4, 2013)** – For the ninth time, the Horseshoe Southern Indiana plays host to the World Series of Poker Circuit. The first event kicked off yesterday and a total of 179 players took their shot in the \$365 No-Limit Hold 'em event. At the end of two day's of play, Bryan Dillon of Prospect, KY demolished the field to claim his second career Circuit ring and a \$14,499 payday.

When we say Dillon demolished the field, we aren't lying. Players reached the nine-handed final table on Day 1 ahead of schedule with Dillon holding a commanding chip lead. Once play resumed on Day 2, it only took the 58-year-old a little over two hours to eliminate the rest of the competition and claim the title.

Dillon is no stranger to the WSOP Circuit. He had previously cashed 12 times on the Circuit and won a ring two years ago right here at Horseshoe Southern Indiana.

Dillon, an attorney from Prospect, KY, is looking to take a run at the Casino Champion title. "I definitely am going to play as many events as I can now," Dillon mentioned after his victory. Dillon also likes having three Circuits stops in his part of the country on this season's schedule.

"Having three WSOP Circuit events in a row in the Midwest is great. I am able to hit all three without having to travel too far. I played in Cincinnati, here and will also be heading up to Hammond," Dillon mentioned.

One thing is for sure, Dillon won't let poker interfere with his work. "I would love to play on Monday, but I have to be in court."

## **Notes on the Event**

- The final table took just over two hours to complete.
- Sixth place finisher Chad Eveslage took third in last years Horseshoe Southern Indiana WSOP Circuit Main Event.

- Mark "Pegasus" Smith, who holds five WSOP Circuit Rings, finished just short of the money.

With his victory, Dillon becomes the points leader in the Horseshoe Southern Indiana standings. The player who accumulates the most overall points in Horseshoe Southern Indiana's twelve combined gold ring tournaments earns the title "Casino Champion" and receives an automatic entry into the 2013-2014 WSOP National Championship, as will the winner of the Horseshoe Southern Indiana Main Event. All players who cash in ring events will receive points that apply to both the Casino Champion race and the seasonlong race to claim one of the at-large National Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season.
