Shahen 'Shawn' Martirosian Seizes Gold in Event 8

Five-time WSOP bracelet winner Allen Cunningham eliminated in ninth, John Zentner in sixth, Brian O'Donoghue in fourth.

Los Angeles, California (March 13, 2014) – On Thursday, the final nine players in Event 8: \$365 No-Limit Hold'em returned to the felt to vie for the \$13,535 in first-place prize money and the gold Circuit ring that accompanies it. In the end, Shahen "Shawn" Martirosian defeated Brian Horowitz heads up and was able to claim the title.

"This feels great," Martirosian said after his win. "It was a long day yesterday and finally I made it to Day 2 so I am happy with the result."

The real estate broker from Woodland Hills, California bested a final table filled with notable names. Five-time WSOP bracelet and two-time Circuit ring winner Allen Cunningham was present at the final table and looked to add a third ring to his collection. Cunningham was the victim of a massive cooler early on, running his pocket kings into Brian O'Donoghue's pocket aces before the flop. Cunningham was eliminated from play and became the first victim of the final table.

John Zentner was also present at the table but ultimately came up short of winning his first gold ring. Zeneter was eliminated from play in sixth place and collected \$2,495 for his winnings.

Three-time Circuit ring winner Brian O'Donoghue was denied his fourth ring when he fell at the hands of Horowtiz. O'Donoghue took home \$4,410 for his fourth-place finish

The final table took much longer to complete than most of the other \$365 events this series and much of the play occurred three-handed. The final three players battled on the felt for over two hours before Jeff Massey, who began the day as the chip lead, was eliminated from play. In his final hand, Massey flopped two pair but was bested by Martirosian's Broadway straight. Massey failed to fill up on the subsequent streets and he was sent to the rail.

"Three-handed was a long time," said Martirosian. "I was short stacked for some point but I kept my cool and tried to make a comeback and it worked out."

Martirosian and Horowitz then battled for over an hour before the match came to a head. In the end it was Martirosian's pocket aces that sealed the deal and awarded him the championship.

Notes on the Event

- This was Allen Cunningham's sixth cash on the Circuit and his third final table appearance.
- A victory in this event propelled Shahen Martirosian to over \$366,000 in career live tournament earnings.

The player who accumulates the most overall points during The Bicycle Casino's gold ring tournaments will earn the title Casino Champion and receive automatic entry into the WSOP National Championship to take place on May 22-24 at Caesars Atlantic City this spring.

All players who cash in ring events receive points that apply toward the Casino Champion's race and the season-long race to claim one of 50 at-large National Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season. More information on the points system is available on WSOP.com.
