Raad Farida Wins his First WSOP Circuit Ring at Harrah's Southern California

Adam Sadick finishes in fourth place in his second final table of the day.

San Diego (December 5, 2014) – The latest World Series of Poker Circuit ring winner is Raad Farida. He won Event #2: \$365 No-Limit Hold'em at Harrah's Southern California. It was his first Circuit victory, and he earned \$11,341.

This was a one-day tournament with a turbo structure. It started with 135 entries, and by the dinner break fewer than half the players remained. Less than five after dinner break ended, Farida held all the chips, and the tournament ended just before midnight.

When the final table began, one of the most interesting developing stories involved Adam Sadick. Sadick finished runner-up in the [first event here at Harrah's SoCal](#). That tournament concluded earlier today at about 2 p.m. He then jumped into this event, and ended up playing two final tables in one day. He eventually bowed out in fourth place (\$3,717).

The event was played over a single day on Friday, December 5, beginning at noon. The final table started just before 10:00 p.m. The tournament ended just before midnight, making the total duration of the tournament about 12 hours.

After Event #2, takes over the lead in the Harrah's Southern California Casino Champion race. Sadick has 65 points from his two final table performances. He's followed by Vincent Moscati and Raad Farida, who both have 50 points. The player who accumulates the most overall points in the twelve gold ring tournaments at Harrah's Southern California earns the title of Casino Champion and receives an automatic entry into the \$1 million 2015 WSOP National Championship. The winner of the Harrah's Southern California Main Event earns an automatic entry to the National Championship as well. All players who cash in ring events will receive points that apply to both the Casino Champion race and the season-long race to claim one of the 50 at-large National Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season. Here is the list of gold ring winners from Harrah's Southern California so far:

EVENT #1: Vincent Moscati defeated 183 players (\$365 No-Limit Hold'em) for \$14,275.

EVENT #2: Raad Farida defeated 185 players \$365 No-Limit Hold'em – 1 Day) for \$11,341.

With the second tournament now wrapped up, there are still 10 more gold ring events before the WSOP Circuit at Harrah's Southern California concludes on December 15.
