## **Nyle Rock Wins Six-Max Event at WSOP Circuit at Harrah's Southern California**

### **Rock Wins 2<sup>nd</sup> Ring Exactly One Year After his First**

**San Diego (December 10, 2014)** – After a long day and a late night of six-handed poker, Nyle Rock became the latest World Series of Poker Circuit ring winner. He won the \$365 No-Limit Hold'em 6-Max tournament at Harrah's Southern California, earning his second career ring and \$11,543.

The tournament attracted a field of 135 players and started at noon on Tuesday. As is typical of six-handed poker, there was a lot of action at every table, and the tournament progressed quickly. Just before midnight, Alex Masek – the all-time leader in Circuit rings – was eliminated in 8th place (\$1,441), and the remaining players combined to the unofficial seven-handed final table. Before long, there were only two players left, Rock and Patrick Curran.

Day 1 of the tournament was scheduled to stop after 21 levels. At that point, with only two players left, the tournament director offered Rock and Curran the option of playing one more level before bagging for the night. They opted to keep playing, and just before the end of the extra level, with chip stacks virtually even, Rock won a big all-in hand. He officially earned the ring just before 3:30 a.m. Wednesday morning.

Before the final table began, Rock half-jokingly said that December 9th is a lucky day for him, especially here at Harrah's SoCal. One year ago, he earned his first WSOP Circuit ring right here in the same room in an event that started on December 9th and ended on the 10th. Now, history has repeated itself, leaving Rock with a tough act to follow for next year's Circuit.

After Event #6, Vincent Moscati retains the lead in the Harrah's Southern California Casino Champion race. Moscati has 82.5 from three cashes, including a victory and a fourth-place finish. Adam Sadick is in second place with 65 points from two final table performances. The player who accumulates the most overall points in the twelve gold ring tournaments at Harrah's Southern California earns the title of Casino Champion and receives an automatic entry into the \$1 million 2015 WSOP National Championship. The winner of the Harrah's Southern California Main Event earns an automatic entry to the National Championship as well. All players who

cash in ring events will receive points that apply to both the Casino Champion race and the season-long race to claim one of the 50 at-large National Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season. EVENT #2: Raad Farida defeated 135 players (\$365 No-Limit Hold'em – 1 Day) for \$11,341.  
EVENT #3: Scott Stewart defeated 526 players (\$365 No-Limit Hold'em Re-entry) for \$33,926.  
EVENT #4: Jason Wortham defeated 106 players (\$365 No-Limit Hold'em) for \$9,542.  
EVENT #5: Tavish Margers defeated 113 players (\$365 No-Limit Hold'em) for \$10,172.  
EVENT #6: Nyle Rock defeated 135 players (\$365 No-Limit Hold'em Six-Handed) for \$11,543.

With the sixth tournament now wrapped up, the WSOP Circuit at Harrah's Southern California is half-way over. There are six more ring events before it concludes on December 15.
