Jared Palmer Wins the Final Event of the Horseshoe S. Indiana Series

Poker pro, Jared Palmer, wins his first WSOP gold ring and is looking for more.

Elizabeth, Ind. (Oct. 12, 2015) -- Jared Palmer has gone on to win the final event of the 2015 WSOP Circuit series at Horseshoe Southern Indiana. He defeated a field of 88 players in just 12 hours to earn his first career WSOP Circuit gold ring and the first place prize of \$8,448.

The 30-year-old from Peebles, Ohio is a professional poker player. This marks his fifth career WSOP cash and second final table. His largest WSOP cash came in the summer of 2014 when he finished in 61st place out of 7,862 entries in the inaugural WSOP Monster Stack event. He earned \$21,758 from just his \$1,500 buy-in. Palmer now has nearly \$40,000 in WSOP tournament earnings.

According to Palmer, he entered the final table second in chips, but the chip leader was on his direct left. Palmer took the chip leader for a massive pot and had about two-thirds of the chips in play with six players remaining. He had his opponents in bad shape and rode his lead to the finish.

Now Palmer has his first ring, but will be going for more. Palmer plans to head to Horseshoe Hammond, which is the next stop on the Circuit.

"I hope there are more [rings]. Now my friends can quit giving me a hard time," said Palmer about winning his first gold ring.

Event #12 was the twelfth of 12 gold ring events on the WSOP Circuit schedule at Horseshoe S. Indiana. The \$365 No-Limit Hold'em tournament attracted 88 players generating a \$26,400 prize pool. The top nine players were paid.

Day 1 began Sunday at 12 p.m.The tournament was scheduled for a two-day event, but Palmer was able to take it down in just one day. The tournament concluded a few minutes after midnight Monday morning.

Notes on the event:

• The only gold ring winner entering the final table was Kevin Davis (seventh). Davis has two career WSOP Circuit gold rings.

Frank Covich accumulated the most overall points during the Horseshoe S. Indiana twelve combined gold ring tournaments and earns the title Casino Champion. He receives automatic entry into the WSOP Global Casino Championship set to take place at the end of the year.

All players who cash in ring events receive points that apply toward the Casino Championship race and the season-long race to claim one of 50 at-large Global Casino Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season.
