Robert Kuhn Wins Main Event at Harrah's Atlantic City

25-year-old poker pro steamrolls a tough final table to win \$122,098 and his first gold ring

Atlantic City, NJ (March 26, 2016) – Robert Kuhn is the newest champion of the WSOP Circuit, dominating a tough final table to win the Harrah's Atlantic City Main Event for \$122,098, a diamond-studded gold ring, and a reserved seat in the 2016 WSOP Global Championship.

Kuhn is a 25-year-old poker pro from Barnesville, Ohio, who splits his time between Mexico (where he plays online poker) and Ohio. This is the first six-figure score for Kuhn, whose previous high was earning \$72,137 for finishing sixth at the WSOP Circuit Hammond Main Event last October.

At the start of the final table, the favorite to win was Ari Engel, who won Event #7 (\$580 No-Limit Hold'em) earlier this series and was playing for the ninth WSOPC ring of his career to tie the all-time record. Kuhn may have started the final table with the chip lead, but Engel was second in chips and had position on Kuhn, sitting on his left.

Engel wasn't the only tough spot, as WSOP bracelet winner Jared Jaffee and two-time WSOPC ring winner Joseph Liberta were also in the mix, though with much smaller chip stacks. But Kuhn was so focused on Engel that he sacrificed sleep to study Engel's recent victory at Aussie Millions.

"I watched about four hours of Aussie Millions footage last night. I had a really good grasp on Ari -- a really good grasp," said Kuhn. "I went to bed at 2:00 and woke up at 7:00 and just studied. I wanted to sleep in, but I just couldn't."

The extra preparation worked for Kuhn, who was never in danger at the final table, only giving up the lead for a single hand with six players remaining. Kuhn immediately bounced back in the next hand by five-bet shoving against Dorian Rios, who tanked for about two minutes before

folding. That pot reclaimed the chip lead for Kuhn, who steamrolled the final table after that point, knocking out four of his five remaining opponents in the next 48 hands to win the title.

Poker is a game of both skill and luck, and it's sometimes difficult to tell how much of a role each one plays. While Kuhn wasn't born under a lucky star, his middle name was directly inspired by some good fortune. "The day before I was born, my dad said, 'If I win at Keno, we're going to name him Keno.' And he ended up winning like fifteen grand — that's a hard game to win at. And mom was like, 'Yeah, I guess his middle name is Keno.'"

The Main Event was the ninth of 12 gold ring events on the WSOP Circuit schedule at Harrah's Atlantic City. The \$1,675 no-limit hold'em event attracted 370 entries, generating a total prizepool of \$555,000. That money was shared by the final 45 players.

The tournament featured two starting flights beginning Wednesday, March 23 and Thursday, March 24 at 12:00 p.m. Flight A drew 131 entries and advanced 23 while Flight B drew 239 and advanced 52. Both starting flights logged 15 levels of play.

Day 2 restarted Friday, March 25 at 12:00 p.m. with 75 players. The money bubble started near the end of Level 17, and finished 23 minutes after the level should have ended (~3:00 p.m.). Play wrapped for the day when the 10th-place finisher was eliminated in the first hand of Level 24 (~10:50 p.m.).

Day 3 began Saturday, March 26 at 12:00 p.m. with the nine-handed final table, and a winner was reached during Level 27 (~4:00 p.m.) in Hand #107, making the total duration of the final table about four hours.

The final table began with 10,000/20,000 blinds and a 3,000-chip ante. Here were the seating assignments and chip counts:

Notable in-the-money finishers included four-time gold ring winner Vincent Moscati (11th place - \$9,346), WSOP bracelet winners Brian Lemke (13th place - \$7,670), Andy Frankenberger (16th place - \$6,388), Geffrey Klein (24th place - \$4,590), and Justin Liberto (40th place - \$2,509), as well as 2012 WSOP Main Event finalist Michael Esposito (25th place - \$3,968).

Ari Engel of Las Vegas, Nevada earned the title of Casino Champion at Harrah's Atlantic City. Engel won the eighth gold ring of his career in Event #7 (\$580 No-Limit Hold'em) before final tabling the Main Event, finishing fourth. Engel accumulated 90 points and \$58,158 in earnings here, and his overall performance allowed him to secure one of the limited seats in the 2016 WSOP Global Casino Championship.

All players who cashed in ring events earned points that apply toward the season-long race to claim one of the limited at-large Global Casino Championship bids, awarded to the top point earners throughout the season. More information on the points system is available on WSOP.com.
