EDWARD HAN SECURES 2ND CIRCUIT GOLD RING

Horseshoe Hammond Casino Champion doubles up on Omaha titles.

Edward Han emerged victorious once again in the Omaha arena, providing himself with a second World Series of Poker gold ring. The poker player from Virginia ran over 102 entrants in Event #8: \$365 Limit Omaha Hi-Lo 8 or Better Re-entry at the Harrah's Atlantic City Circuit stop.

Coming into Day 2 of the tournament with a commanding chip lead, Han maintained his dominance till the very end.

"I mean, I was running pretty well, and I think people were just over folding... So, I was happy with it. It worked out," mentioned Han after his victory.

Han keep his composure even in the face of stacked final table. Among the final ten players of Event #8, sat two gold bracelet winners, Edward Fishman and Chris Reslock, as well as players with multiple gold rings to their name, including Allen Kessler and Roland Israelashvili.

Jason Rivkin was Han's final opponent. Rivkin, owner of one gold ring, finished 2nd in the same exact event a year ago. Unfortunately for the 30-year-old poker pro, history repeated itself, as he walked away as the runner-up, good for \$5,674. Han was awarded \$9,180 for first place.

Along with the WSOP cash, Han secured his second career gold ring. His first gold ring materialized earlier this season at the Horseshoe Hammond Circuit stop where he also reigned supreme as Casino Champion.

On par with his trip to the Horseshoe Hammond in October, Han traveled to Atlantic City, New Jersey with his friend, and fellow poker player, Andrew Moser.

“You always got to go with a buddy. It just makes things easier, talking about hands, somebody to travel with, make the room cheaper,” Han explained “What’s interesting is each time I make a side bet with my friend [Moser]... \$100 for a final table. \$500 for a ring... we get it.”

With a bit of extra motivation, Han soared to another momentous finish. Both of Han's rings were won in an Omaha event. The first achievement came in Pot-Limit Omaha and the second, Omaha Hi-Lo, a game which Han is well versed.

“Actually, when I first started playing poker I played PLO 8,” he said “So, I’m very familiar with Hi-Lo and I played a lot of Limit Hi-Lo online, back in the day.”

The 29-year-old now has his sights set on attempting to win rings in all different kinds of tournaments. The Harrah's Atlantic City Main Event, which begins tomorrow at noon, will be his next shot.

“I think my goal now is just to have as many different variety of rings as possible,” Han said with a smile. “I guess I’ll make that a goal for the future.”
