## A Fairytale Ending

Aspiring screenwriter turned poker pro breaks through in Event 3 with first big poker score.

Elizabeth, IN (October 4, 2011) - Last week, 31-year-old Greg Joslyn made a 15-hour drive from New York to Southern Indiana to enter a few WSOP Circuit events. He wasn't sure what to expect, but he knew he wanted play cards. Joslyn did just that as he bet and raised his way through a star-studded final table that included the likes of the all-time leader in Circuit victories, Mark Smith.

Poker wasn't always the path Joslyn envisioned himself taking. Six years ago he went to college to become a screenwriter. After some time in the classroom and hands-on experience writing screenplays, he realized it wasn't for him. When he came across poker, he fell in love instantly. He has been playing poker for six years, but really began dedicating himself over the last two. When asked what's next after winning his first Circuit ring, Joslyn responded, "I'll probably go win another one."

With only 13 players remaining from 175 starting, Joslyn found himself with the chip lead going into Day 2. Play began at 3:00 p.m. EST, and the final table was formed shortly after 4 p.m. Players moved fast, and Joslyn was crowned champion just before 10 p.m. local time.

Other notable finishers include Barbara Walston. She was the lone female to cash in the \$555 No-Limit Hold'em tournament and narrowly missed making the final table when her Queen Jack never improved versus the King Nine of her opponent. Walston finished the tournament in eleventh place.

Joining Joslyn and Smith at the unofficial final table of 10 was Danny Sweeney. This was Sweeney's second cash of the WSOP Circuit at Horseshoe Southern Indiana and he had his sights on his second final table until he ran Ace Queen into the pocket Aces of Smith. Sweeney finished in tenth place and with that, the final table was set.

#### **Third Place:**

The third place finisher was Mark Smith. Smith hails from Georgetown, Kentucky and he is the winningest player in WSOP Circuit history. Earlier this stop he surpassed Men "The Master" Nguyen and Chris Reslock in Circuit victories by winning the \$345 No-Limit Hold'em Event 1 and earning his fifth ring.

With four players remaining, Smith was leading in chips and poised to get ring number six, but as blinds and antes went up, Smith's chip stack suffered. Smith moved all-in for his remaining 134,000 chips with pocket Threes. He was called by the Ace Ten of Joslyn and they were off to the races. Joslyn flopped a pair of Tens on a 10 9 8 board and Smith's tournament was all but over. However, it seemed the stars were aligning for Smith, and the board ran out 7, Jack. Both players played the Jack-high straight and split the pot. Good fortune didn't stick with Smith for long, as he was eliminated in third place, just shy of a record-extending victory.

#### **Third Place Finisher, Mark Smith:**

What does a player with a resume like yours take, from a performance like this? You were very close, but didn't get that sixth ring we all know you wanted. – "You can't play without cards totally. Patience always gets you there. I got down in the seventh level to 2,800 in chips and came back. Biblically patience is a virtue. I think that is true in poker also. I think I played one of my best tournaments I've ever played. I'm very pleased with myself and my play.

Are you focusing your concentration on winning the Casino Championship here at Horseshoe Southern Indiana, or is your focus just rings? – "I want to win rings. That's number one. I hope the 80 points I've earned gets the casino championship. I am going to take tomorrow off, rest up. Then I'll be back to play the rest of the week.

What did you say to 24-year-old Adam Foster after when he finished in fourth place? – "He wanted that ring so bad. He'd talked about it all last night and today. If I couldn't win it I wanted him to have it. None of the other fellas have one. It's special to all of them, I just happen to know Adam better than the other players."

This is the third of 12 ring events slated to take place at the Horseshoe Southern Indiana. Winners of all events will receive first-place prize money and the coveted WSOP Circuit ring. The winner of the Main Event will also receive a seat to the \$1 million Circuit National Championship in Las Vegas. Another seat will be awarded to the individual who earns the most Circuit points at this stop. Currently, Smith leads at the Horseshoe Southern Indiana with first and third place finishes totaling 80 points.

The WSOP Circuit Events at Horseshoe Southern Indiana continue through October 10. The Main Event will take place October 8.
