ANOTHER CHAMPION AT HORSESHOE HAMMOND

David Costain Wins First Ring and \$64,000 in Event #2.

Hammond, IN (October 17, 2011)—Event #2 went off without a hitch at Horseshoe Hammond. The \$560 No-Limit Hold'em drew a healthy 648 players creating a prizepool of almost \$315,000.

The most recent WSOPC champion is David Costain. Costain worked his way through a marathon final table that ended at 5 a.m. CST and included two-time ring winner, Joel Casper (fourth, \$21,745) and four-time Circuit casher, Josh Pender (sixth, \$12,518).

"It feels great to have a ring," Costain said. "I'm a day late getting home, but I think it will be worth it."

Costain is a 37-year-old technician with Colgate Palmolive in Cambridge, Ohio. He spends anywhere from 20 to 50 hours a week playing poker and considers himself a semi-pro. St. Clairsville, Ohio has been his home all his life and he resides there with his lovely wife and two children. He travels to many Circuit stops, and it's difficult being away from family, but Costain says they could not be more supportive of him as he pursues what he loves.

Day 1 began with 648 entrants at 12 p.m. About 13 hours after that, the money bubble burst and play was called for the day with 72 players remaining, all guaranteed at least \$880. The cards were back in the air at 2 p.m. the following day and it took about eight hours to get down to the unofficial final table of 10.

Horseshoe Hammond added nine \$1,600 Main Event seats to the prizepool. It was clear how much the Main Event seats meant to the players as 10-handed play tightened up and lasted the better part of three hours. Ryan Beckwith from Stoughton, Wisconsin was the unfortunate bubble boy. He missed the official final table and free entry into the Main Event by one spot, but he was sent home with a \$4,846 consolation prize.

You just won your first Circuit ring. How does it feel? – "It feels real good to have a ring. It's a great event. My wife and kids back home support me as I'm out here playing. I'm a day late getting home, but I think it will be worth it."

What does the ring mean to you? – "The World Series of Poker is such a great event. I'm not a jewelry person, but it means something having the win and the ring."

This is the second of 12 ring events slated to take place at the Horseshoe Hammond. Winners of all events will receive first-place prize money and the coveted WSOP Circuit ring. In addition, the winner of the Main Event will receive a seat to the \$1 million Circuit National Championship in Las Vegas. An additional seat will be awarded to the individual who earns the most Circuit points at this stop.

The WSOP Circuit Events at Horseshoe Hammond continue through October 24. The Main Event will take place October 21.
