TOURNAMENT REPORT

Canadian Tears Up Turbo Championship, Pockets \$17K

Las Vegas, NV (January 30, 2012) – The World Series of Poker Circuit concluded today at Caesars Palace in Las Vegas.

The winner of the latest and last WSOP Circuit tournament at Caesars Palace this season was Alemu Makonen, from Edmonton, Alberta (Canada)

Makonen pocketed \$17,168 in prize money for his victory. He was also presented with his first WSOP Circuit gold ring.

Event #12 was a one-day \$300 (+50) Turbo No-Limit Hold'em tournament, which attracted 236 entrants. The turbo format means the blind levels are shorter, which makes for a faster tournament. Players tend to bust out faster and the tournament ends within a single day,

Play began on Monday at noon and concluded that same night. The total prize pool came to \$68,676. The top 24 finishers were paid. All players who cashed received WSOP Circuit National Championship ranking points – used to potentially qualify for a seat in the season-ending championship, to be played in Las Vegas.
