## FIELDER HAULS IN A CIRCUIT RING

Jeffrey Fielder wins Event 12 in Council Bluffs. Doug "Rico" Carli records 60th career WSOP Circuit cash.

**Council Bluffs, IA (April 10, 2012)**—After 13 days of tournament poker, the twelfth and final ring event concluded Tuesday evening in Council Bluffs, IA.

The winner of Event 12 was 34-year-old Jeffrey Fielder. He bested a final table that included the likes of six-time WSOP final tablist, Michael "MJ the Great" Cooper and lifetime leader in Circuit cashes Doug "Rico" Carli. Carli's 60th career cash separated himself further from second place Mark Smith (31).

Fielder was awarded the coveted WSOP Circuit gold ring and \$10,128 for his efforts.

"I've been chasing a ring for a while," Fielder said. "It feels good. I'm relieved."

Event 12 drew 116 entrants and created a prizepool of \$33,756. The top 12 finishers were awarded prizes and the final table played out simultaneously with the Main Event.

On the final hand, Fielder's [Jd][Td] bested the [Jx][8x] of Kelly Vandemheen on a [Tx][6x][7x][8x][6x] board.

"I wasn't very proud of my ten kicker, but it worked out," Fielder said.
