## **Martin Levert Wins Lac-Leamy's Final Ring**

**Two events remain on EspaceJeux.com and Nimer Ltaif leads Casino Championship.**

**Gatineau, QC (November 25, 2013)** — Martin Levert won the final live ring event of the Casino Lac-Leamy Circuit series Monday night just outside Canada's capital city. The victory came in Event 10, a \$365 No-Limit Hold'em tournament, and awarded the Quebec resident \$9,542, a gold ring and 50 points toward the Casino Championship.

Levert is admittedly an amateur. In fact, he claims he wasn't even aware the WSOP was running an event at Lac-Leamy until the last minute. What's more, the series marked his first-ever tournament and he arrived just in time for the final event.

"I'm very proud. I'm going to be showing it to all my friends," Levert said of the ring. "Hopefully when I go to another tournament I can wear it and win a bracelet one day."

Joining Levert at the final table was Nimer Ltaif. Ltaif has had a series for the ages, recording five cashes including three final tables and a 32nd-place finish in the Main Event. While his most recent deep run came up short of gold, his third place finish in Event 10 earned him 30 points toward the Casino Championship – enough to leapfrog the previous points leader, Adam Podstawka, by 17.5.

Ltaif leads the field with 97.5 points and two online ring events remaining to be decided on EspaceJeux.com. When these events wrap, the player who lays claim to the most points earns the title Casino Champion and joins the Main Event winner Charles Sylvestre at the National Championship this spring.

The Circuit series at Lac-Leamy marked the first time for a WSOP event to take place in the Canadian province of Quebec. Events began November 13 and ran through this evening. The series was a tremendous success going off without a hitch and drawing rave reviews from all in attendance.

Some of Canada's most decorated pros, including bracelet winners Sylvestre, Erik Cajelais and Scott Montgomery, attended the series. Additionally, top mixed-game player Mike Leah final tabled the Main Event.

With all these names though, it was first-time player Levert who came out on top in the final event.

“...It was very impressive and I enjoyed it,” Levert said of the event. “It’s not going to be my last one.”

Event 10 was the last of the live gold ring events on the WSOP Circuit schedule at Casino Lac-Leamy. The \$365 No-Limit Hold’em tournament attracted 106 players generating a \$31,800 prize pool. The top 12 players were paid.

Day 1 began Sunday at 12 p.m. and reached the 10-handed final table shortly after 11 p.m. The finale began Monday at 1 p.m. and concluded at about 7 p.m.

Two additional gold ring events are set to take place December 7 and 8 on EspaceJeux.com in partnership with the Lac-Leamy series, bringing the total rings awarded to 12.

### **Notes on the Event**

- Nimer Ltaif took the Casino Championship lead with his third-place finish.
- Event 10 was the last of 10 live gold ring events at the Casino Lac-Leamy Circuit series. Two additional gold ring events remain to be decided on EspaceJeux.com December 7 and 8.

The player who accumulates the most overall points during Casino Lac-Leamy’s twelve combined gold ring tournaments earns the title Casino Champion and receives automatic entry into the WSOP National Championship to take place at Caesars Atlantic City this spring.

All players who cash in ring events receive points that apply toward the Casino Champion’s race and the season-long race to claim one of 50 at-large National Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season. More information on the points system is available on WSOP.com.
