Mixed max events are tough and they will test the best players in the game. It takes a full arsenal of skills to succeed and win these type of tournaments. To no surprise the \$1,500 No Limit Hold'em Mix Max event had two of the best in the game square off heads up for the bracelet. Jared Jaffee and Mike Watson found themselves heads up for the bracelet after three full days of playing different variations of No Limit Hold'em. After all was said and done, Jaffee was able to show that he had the unique and versatile skill set to win the biggest mix maxed event the WSOP has ever hosted. He earned his first ever WSOP gold bracelet as well as the top prize money of \$405,428.

"I felt like there were a bunch of spots in the past where I was right there and could have gotten [a bracelet] and I didn't. I kind of felt like I was in the zone all day yesterday and today. It just felt like I was going to win." said Jaffee about winning his first bracelet. "Today I thought it was my time."

The 33-year-old poker pro is from Brooklyn, New York and has been a regular at the WSOP for the past six years. This marks Jaffee's 11th WSOP cash and more than doubles his WSOP earnings. His previous top finish at the WSOP was a third place in the \$2,500 No Limit Hold'em Four-Handed event last year.
