Justin Liberto Wins the Last Ring of 2014

Just Liberto follows up his Main Event bubble result with a gold ring in the final event of 2014.

Atlantic City, N.J. (**December 22, 2014**) -- Justin Liberto has won Event #12 – \$365 No-Limit Hold'em Turbo, which is the last gold ring event of 2014. He won this event soon after coming up just short in the series' Main Event. He ended up finishing on the stone money bubble in the Main Event just won day prior to this victory.

"I was stone bubble boy of the Main," said Liberto. "I guess I made up for it a little bit. It's like I got 11th in the Main or something like that."

As he should be, Liberto was disappointed about his unfortunate result in the Main Event. However, winning the next event he played helped with the disappointment. He said that he is pretty excited about winning a ring. According to Liberto, he has a few close calls, so it's nice to finally get a ring.

Last year Liberto finished runner-up in the Harrah's Philadelphia Main Event for \$71,664. That is not even his biggest WSOP cash though. Liberto made the final table and finished in fourth place in the WSOP's inaugural Millionaire Maker in 2013. He took home \$400,408 for his \$1,500 buy-in.

Event #12 was the final gold ring events on the WSOP Circuit schedule at Harrah's Resort Atlantic City in Atlantic City, New Jersey. It was also the final gold ring event of 2014. The \$365 No-Limit Hold'em Turbo tournament attracted 126 players generating a \$37,800 prize pool. The top 15 players were paid.

This was a one-day event. The tournament began Monday at 12 p.m. It finished about 11 p.m. It was the last event to finish at the series and the Atlantic City WSOP Circuit series is now complete.

Notes on the event:

• Paul Sokoloff (14th place) recorded his fifth cash of the series in this event. It was the most of any competitor.

The player who accumulates the most overall points during the Harrah's Resort Atlantic City twelve combined gold ring tournaments earns the title Casino Champion and receives automatic entry into the WSOP National Championship set to take place at the end of the year.

All players who cash in ring events receive points that apply toward the Casino Championship race and the season-long race to claim one of 50 at-large National Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season. More information on the points system is available on WSOP.com.
