JOHN REYNOLDS CLAIMS NLHE 6-HANDED RING

Tulsa's "Cracker" Reynolds wins \$17,335 and first career Circuit ring in Event #7 victory

Another gold Circuit ring is staying in Tulsa. John "Cracker" Reynolds, a popular grinder, has taken down Event #7 at Circuit Hard Rock Tulsa, \$250 No-Limit Hold'em, to earn his first career gold Circuit ring and a first-place \$17,335 cash.

Reynolds, 42, had to survive a fearsome final seven in this event. Five of the last seven players were prior Circuit ring winners, including second-overall 11-time winner Maurice Hawkins, and the only other player in the running late without a previous Circuit win was 2003 Main Event Champion Chris Moneymaker. Moneymaker held more than a 2:1 lead over Reynolds when their heads-up duel began, but a willing-to-gamble Reynolds soon doubled through to the lead, then closed out the win.

Hamrick, 42, who is married and the father of five, is himself a veteran of regional Circuit stops. Though this is his first Circuit win, it's not his largest cash; he's amassed over \$170,000 in career winnings in WSOP and WSOP Circuit events.
